through the MySBA Certifications website. Please refer to the attached supplemental page for more details and examples.

- **System for Award Management (SAM.gov):** You must keep the business' SAM.gov profile and SBS records up-to-date in order for the business to receive benefits from our Programs (i.e., to be identified by contracting officers as eligible to be awarded small business set-aside contracts and to be paid under any such contracts). You must validate your business' SAM.gov information at least annually or your SAM.gov registration will become inactive. If you need assistance in updating the business' SAM.gov or SBS information, please go to the SAM.gov Help Desk at <https://fsd.gov/fsd-gov/home.do>.
- **Notices from SBA:** You are responsible for responding to notices from SBA, including but not limited to notices regarding certification renewals, eligibility reviews, protests, proposed decertification and termination actions, and recertification requirements. All SBA Programs send such notices to the business' email address listed in its MySBA Profile. If the business fails to respond to these notices, SBA will propose the business for decertification or termination and may subsequently decertify or terminate it from participation in SBA Programs. Therefore, it is critical that you keep the business' SAM.gov and MySBA profiles current, including listing an active email address for contacting the business, and check your email's SPAM folder to make sure that you are receiving emails from SBA.
- **Contracting Requirements:** You are required to comply with limitations on subcontracting requirements and nonmanufacturer rule when performing any small business set-aside contracts (see 13 CFR 125.6)

Supplemental Information on Reporting Changes:

You must notify SBA of the following changes within 30 calendar days of any such change:

8(a), WOSB and VetCert:

You must notify SBA of any material changes that could affect your businesses' eligibility within 30 calendar days of any such change. Material change includes, but is not limited to:

- a change to the business's ownership, business structure, or control
- a closure
- a filing of a bankruptcy

VetCert only:

- a change in a current owner's Veteran status
- a change in a Veteran-owner's active-duty status

HUBZone only:

- Involvement in a merger or acquisition

Failure to notify SBA of a material change may result in decertification and removal from SAM and SBS (or any successor system) as a designated certified business. In addition, SBA may seek the imposition of penalties under [§ 124.521; § 126.900; [§ 127.700](#); § 128.600].
